How Projective Tests Are Used to Measure Personality

Projective tests are commonly used in the measurement of personality. In a projective test, respondents must interpret or describe an ambiguous stimulus (as in a Rorschach inkblot or a Thematic Apperception Test photo), or come up with a drawing in response to a minimal prompt ("Draw a person"), or say a word in response to a stimulus word (as in Jung's Word Association Test).
