What were the Effects of the Glorious Revolution?

Restoration and Revolution: Oliver Cromwell ruled as "Lord Protector" until his death in 1658. He was succeeded by his son, Richard. Although Richard was not entirely without ability, he had no power base in either Parliament or the Army, and was forced to resign in May 1659. At this time, Parliament voted to ask the older son of Charles I to
