William Magear Tweed (April 3, 1823 – April 12, 1878) – often erroneously referred to as "William Marcy Tweed" (see below), and widely known as "Boss" Tweed – was an American politician most notable for being the "boss" of Tammany Hall, the Democratic Party political machine that played a major role in the politics of 19th century New York City and State.

The substantial power held by Boss Tweed and Tammany Hall was achieved through political corruption. Business monopolies controlled the voting rights of citizens through Boss Tweed. The political machine became stronger as Boss Tweed built more factories. The greediness of Boss Tweed led to his downfall and the subsequent rise of Tammany Hall.

William "Boss" Tweed began his rise to influence in the late 1840s as a volunteer fireman in New York City. From this inauspicious beginning, Tweed managed to build a power base in his ward.
