(a) Inform each person who is requested to serve as a confidential informant that the agency cannot promise inducements such as a grant of immunity, dropped or reduced charges, or reduced sentences or placement on probation in exchange for serving as a confidential informant.

a confidential informant as any individual who provides useful and credible information to a law enforcement agency regarding felonious criminal activities, and from whom the law enforcement agency expects or intends to obtain additional useful and credible information regarding such activities in the future.

FOIA requests filed last year with various federal agencies for "guidelines and policies" for the use of confidential informants returned only one completed response and several rejection, making significant public accountability regarding the practice all but impossible.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S GUIDELINES REGARDING THE USE OF ...

The following Guidelines regarding the use of confidential informants are issued under the authority of the Attorney General as provided in sections 509, 510, and 533 of title 28, United States Code. They apply to the use of confidential informants in criminal investigations and prosecutions by Department of Justice law enforcement agencies and federal prosecuting offices as specified in paragraph (I)(A) below.

Attorney General Reno's Confidential Informant Guidelines ...

CI Guidelines, § IV.B.1. The Confidential Informant Guidelines require that notice of the unauthorized illegal activity be provided by the Special Agent in Charge of the field office operating the CI to the U.S. Attorney or DOJ component head, not by subordinate FBI field office personnel to other U.S. Attorneys' Offices or DOJ personnel.

Any person who is requested to act as a confidential informant shall, upon request, be afforded the opportunity to consult with legal counsel prior to agreeing to perform any activities as a confidential informant.

Confidential Defendant Informants (CDI) - Confidential informants who

are current defendants in pending court cases and expect compensation in the form of judicial or prosecutorial considerations. Register all CDIs. Inactive Confidential Informants - Confidential informants not debriefed within a year, or declared inactive by the control officer.

Department of Justice Guidelines Regarding the Use of ...

1. No Interference With an Investigation of a Confidential Informant. A JLEA agent must take the utmost care to avoid interfering with or impeding any criminal investigation or arrest of a CI. No agent shall reveal to a CI any information relating to an investigation of the CI.
