

Current Cpr Guidelines 2013 Red Cross

The Revised American Heart Association CPR Guidelines

The new guidelines do not have any major changes, but here are some of the basics: No more than 120 compressions per minute with a minimum of 100. Chest compressions for adults should be no more than 2.4 inches and at least 2 inches.

- If two trained responders are present, one should perform CPR while the second responder operates the AED.
- If at any time you notice an obvious sign of life, stop CPR and monitor breathing and for any changes in condition. STAND CLEAR Make sure no one, including you, is touching the child or infant. Say, “EVERYONE, STAND CLEAR.”
