This requires a different type of formal assessment. Standardized tests have standard instructions like content, format, timings, etc.

Comparison between Standardised and Teacher-Made Tests

Standardized vs. Standards-Based Tests. The point is to insure that there is the same number of F's as A's, and the same number of D's as B's, and that most people score in the C range. Suppose a teacher gives an exam, and then grades it on the curve. Furthermore, assume that the highest score on the exam was a 40%.

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
