Trained telecommunicators, using locally approved EMD Guidecards, quickly and properly determine the nature and priority of the call, dispatch the appropriate response, then give the caller instructions to help treat the patient until the responding EMS unit arrives.

Dispatcher Training Subcommittee. The Dispatcher Training Subcommittee serves to ensure that requirements defined in the 911 statute are met. This includes compliance with mandated Dispatcher Training Standards, and review, approval, and monitoring of State 911 Committee (SNC) approved training courses.

To begin training as an emergency dispatcher, you must first earn a high school diploma or pass the General Educational Development (GED) examination. In addition, because most emergency dispatchers work with police and fire departments, background checks are typically completed on every applicant before training commences.

Telecommunicators who provide Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) have additional training requirements. Training mandates are post-hire, though agencies may prefer individuals who have had training. Pre-hire requirements may vary from agency to agency within the state. A dispatcher generally needs only a high school diploma/ GED, though higher education can facilitate career mobility and, in some cases, prove helpful in achieving a first position.

Fire Emergency Dispatcher / 911 Operator

911 Operators usually require a high school diploma or a GED. They generally receive on-the-job training that may include completing a certificate program. CPR certification may also be required.

Upon being hired, most agencies require the completion of a comprehensive training program for dispatchers, which may include classes and on-the-job training. Each agency sets its own standards for training, although most follow state standards. Typical courses within a dispatcher training program often include the following:
