General points All providers of primary care must ensure that their staff have immediate access to appropriate resuscitation equipment and drugs when needed. The standard AED sign should be used in order to reduce delay in locating a defibrillator in an emergency .

The Emergency Medicine Society of South Africa has published a document known as Practice Guideline EM006, Resuscitation Trolley Equipment in general practice areas, in-hospital wards, clinics and other non-emergency areas which set out the minimum recommended contents of the emergency trolley for areas of the hospitals other than casualty [2] .

5. A checklist should be attached to the trolley at all times. 6. The trolley should not have additional unnecessary equipment. 7. Trolley contents should be rechecked after each use. The following tables list the contents that must be on all adult resuscitation trolleys in the Obstetrics and Gynaecology Directorate.

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The emergency trolley checklist book from each ward indicated that the emergency trolleys had been checked on a daily basis only in the A&E unit of hospital A and in the ICU of hospital B. In the remaining wards, the practice of checking the trolley was apparently infrequent and/or not recorded in the checklist book.

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A checklist of emergency drugs and equipment was adapted and edit from the Emergency Medicine Society of South Africa (EMSSA) guidelines was used as the audit tool to evaluate if the emergency trolley list in the maternity section complied with recommended guidelines for the type of emergency equipment, drugs and the emergency trolley available.

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
