What are the exposition, rising action, climax and falling ...  
Falling action occurs right after the climax, when the main problem of the story resolves. It is one of the elements of the plot of the story, the other elements being exposition, rising action, climax, and resolution. Falling action wraps up the narrative, resolves its loose ends, and leads toward the closure.

A drama is then divided into five parts, or acts, which some refer to as a dramatic arc: exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and catastrophe. Freytag extends the five parts with three moments or crises: the exciting force, the tragic force, and the force of the final suspense.

Plot Structure (exposition, rising action, climax, falling ...  
Exposition: Introduction to the characters, setting, and basic plot. Rising Action: Any events that occur leading up to the climax. Climax: The highest point of tension in a story. "The moment before the branch snaps" sort of deal. Falling Action: Events after the climax, beginning to close the story, and leading to the resolution.

Macbeth (exposition, rising action, falling action ...  
The falling action occurs immediately after the climax and details the consequences -- good or bad -- that the characters must deal with after the turning point of events. It leads up to the resolution and sets the stage for the final chapter of the story.

Rising Action - Definition and Examples | LitCharts  
Any event that occurs after the exposition but before the climax or turning point of the story is called rising action. During the rising action, the main character or protagonist of the story may struggle with the conflict but be unable to resolve it.
