Gilded Age Study guide. It was a period of various economic depressions and corruption. The term was coined by Mark Twain, and it refers to a gilt metal: it is gold on the outside (beautiful), but if you dig a little deeper you find what truly lies beneath (hideous).

Carnegie started working at the age of 13 in a cotton mill for \$1.20 a week. By the age of 18 he was the Post Secretary to the Superintendent in the Pennsylvania Railroad Company. During the Civil War, he boss took a job in the US War Department and Carnegie was promoted. By 30 years of age he was earning over \$500,000 a year.

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
