A prime lens has a fixed focal length, so you have to bring additional lenses of different focal lengths for various shooting ranges. You need to bring just one zoom lens (instead of two to three prime lenses) that covers the full range of focal lengths.

If your camera has an APS-C sensor (Nikon DX DSLRs, Sony NEX...) it has a crop factor of 1.5 - meaning you multiply the lens focal length by 1.5 to get its equivalent 35 mm-format focal length. For Canon APS-C cameras that number is 1.6, for Micro Four Thirds cameras it's 2.0 and for the Nikon 1 series it's 2.7.

Fixed focal length lenses which don't zoom (also widely known as 'primes') just have a single number (e.g. 50mm). Here, we can see this lens' key specifications expressed in terms of its focal length span ('zoom range) which is 18-35mm, and its minimum aperture range, which is F3.5 at 18mm, and F4.5 at 35mm.

Modern day lenses have an electronic connection with the digital SLR camera. This connection relays information from lens to camera so that you can change setting on the lens (like aperture) from the camera body itself. Digital SLR Lens connectors are manufacturer-specific. This means that you can only get lenses made by the SAME manufacturer that made your camera, or a third-party lens that is compatible with your camera.
