Discovery learning is an inquiry-based, constructivist learning theory that takes place in problem solving situations where the learner draws on his or her own past experience and existing knowledge to discover facts and relationships and new truths to be learned.

The command style is the most teacher-directed style of the seven styles (Mosston & Ashworth, 1994). In this type of style the teacher is the exclusive decision maker. Decisions on what to do, how to do it, and the level of achievement expected are all determined by the teacher (Nichols, 1994).

In guided discovery activities, the teacher provides learners with the chance to be exposed to and analyse language in order to help them understand the rules by themselves. By using a task, questions or awareness-raising activities, students are led to identify the use, meaning, form and pronunciation of the target language.

The Spectrum of Teaching Styles: Style F - Guided-Discovery

In the Guided Discovery Style, the role of the teacher is to make all pre-impact decisions including the subject matter's target concept and the sequential questions that lead to the target answer and all logistical decisions.

The spectrum of teaching styles were first designed by Mosston and Ashworth as they designed a cohesive framework to serve as a guide for physical education teachers. It consists of 11 different teaching styles, five teacher-centered (aka reproductive/direct) and six student-centered (aka productive/indirect).

1. One of the four teaching style s. The teacher asks a series of guiding questions that allows the student to discover the answers. Guided Discovery is very effective in fully engaging the student to believe what is being taught, since the student is the one discovering the answers.

Guided discovery learning is a constructivist instructional design model that combines principles from discovery learning and sometimes radical constructivism with principles from cognitivist instructional design theory. "Students discover knowledge without guidance, developing their own understanding.

Improving Player Development With Guided Discovery ...

Guided-discovery problems can be incorporated into lecture, lab, and field courses. They fit beautifully into the exploration phase of the learning cycle approach to teaching (Brown and Abell, 2007). Thus they work best when they are assigned before any lectures or readings on the topic.

Discovery Learning (Bruner) - Learning Theories

With the command style, the coach explains a skill, demonstrates the skill and allows the players to practice the skill. In contrast to "reproduction" of knowledge in the coach-centered approach, the guided discovery approach emphasizes the "production" of new talents.

How to Use Guided Discovery Problems

The delegator style is best suited for curricula that require lab activities, such as chemistry and biology, or subjects that warrant peer feedback, like debate and creative writing. Pros : Guided discovery and inquiry-based learning place the teacher in an observer role that inspires students by working in tandem toward common goals.
