Whether you want to pair your Apple Watch with a new phone, restore it to factory settings to troubleshoot it, or plan to pass it on to a new owner, you're going to need to unpair it from your current iPhone, back up its data, and disable Activation Lock so that it can be set up again.

Turn on or restart your MacBook Pro. Hold down Command and R at the same time right after you restart your Mac. Keep holding down the keys until your Mac finishes loading and you see the macOS Utilities window.

Reboot MacBook Pro

If the Mac has a power button on the keyboard, like all modern MacBook laptops do, this is how you forcibly reboot it: Hold down the Power button on the keyboard until the MacBook shuts down completely, this may take 5 seconds or so. Wait a few seconds then hit the Power button again to boot the Mac.

Force restart iPhone X and later, iPhone 8, or iPhone 8 Plus. ... When the Apple logo appears, release the button. Note: If iPhone still doesn't turn on, or if it gets stuck during start up, see the Apple Support article If your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch won't turn on or is frozen.

Press the Power button and "Shift-Control-Option" on the left side of the Macbook Air's built-in keyboard all at the same time. Wait a second and then release the keys and the power button at the same time. Press the Power button to turn the MacBook Air back on. This resets the SMC.

How to manually reboot a frozen Mac?

Keep in mind that Apple now refers to the Sleep/Wake button as the Side button as of the iPhone 8, iPhone 8 Plus, and iPhone X. Press and quickly release the Volume Up button. Press and quickly release the Volume Down button. Press and hold the Side button (aka power) until you see the Apple logo.

Step 2: Erase Mac hard drive. Choose Disk Utility in the Utilities window. Click on the Continue button. Choose your startup disk. Click Erase from the buttons at the top of the Disk Utilities window. Choose Mac OS Extended (Journaled) from the menu. Click Erase.
