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An independent contractor can be any type of business entity (sole proprietor, corporation, LLC, partnership), but most independent contractors are sole proprietors. Since the independent contractor is not an employee, no payroll taxes are deducted from payments to the contractor, so the contractor is responsible for paying self-employment taxes (Social Security and Medicare), along with income taxes.
