1.1 Basic Concepts: Arguments, Premises, & Conclusions  
1. If we can benefit someone, without harming anyone else, we ought to do so. 2. Transplanting the organs would benefit the other children without harming Baby Theresa. 3. Therefore, we ought to transplant the organs. [from 1 & 2] How good is this argument? The argument is valid. That is, the conclusion follows from the premises.
