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Management SBO •All cases –Aggressive fluid resuscitation, – bowel decompression –Analgesia and antiemetic –early surgical consultation –Antibiotics •Non operative –Adhesive obstruction » If no peritonitis » Atleast 72 h (60 to 85% resolve) –Inflammatory obstruction / acute disease / diverticulitis

Objective: Intestinal obstruction is a blockage of the intestinal content through bowel. The block must be complete and permanent. Obstruction can be mechanical, simple or strangulated, and paralytic.

Small bowel obstruction (SBO) is a common reason for elderly patients to be admitted to hospital under the care of general surgery. Treatment may involve immediate surgery, a trial of nonoperative management followed by surgery, or nonoperative management leading to resolution of obstruction.

Guidelines for Management of Small Bowel Obstruction

The definitive management of bowel obstruction is dependent on the aetiology and whether it has been complicated by bowel ischaemia and/or peritonism. These patients are often intravascularly fluid deplete.

He or she may examine your abdomen and listen to your bowel sounds with a stethoscope. X-ray. To confirm a diagnosis of intestinal obstruction, your doctor may recommend an abdominal X-ray.

Intestinal obstruction is a blockage that keeps food or liquid from passing through your small intestine or large intestine (colon). Causes of obstruction may include fibrous bands of tissue (adhesions) in the abdomen that form after surgery, an inflamed intestine (Crohn's disease), diverticula or pouches in your intestine (diverticulitis), hernias and colon cancer.

Obstruction of the GI tract is the result of a blockage when the normal flow of intestinal content is impeded by a constricted or occluded lumen or when there is impaired motility (paralytic obstruction may be in small or large intestine, complete or partial obstruction and may be due to mechanical or paralytic ileus).

The management of bowel obstruction depends upon the etiology, severity, and location of the obstruction. The goals of initial management are to relieve discomfort and restore normal fluid volume and electrolytes in preparation for possible surgical intervention.

Clear Liquid Diet. A partial bowel obstruction diet can be a clear liquid diet, which consists of only liquids that are clear. Water, clear apple juice, clear soda, ice pops, broth, black tea, and black coffee are all considered clear liquids. Your doctor will determine how long you need to be on a clear liquid diet.

Management and outcomes of small bowel obstruction in ...

Bowel obstruction, also known as intestinal obstruction, is a mechanical or functional obstruction of the intestines which prevents the normal movement of the products of digestion. Either the small bowel or large bowel may be affected. Signs and symptoms include abdominal pain, bloating and not passing gas. Mechanical obstruction is the cause of about 5 to 15% of cases of severe small bowel obstruction.

Intestinal perforation, defined as a loss of continuity of the bowel wall, is a potentially devastating complication that may result from a variety of processes. Common causes of perforation include trauma, instrumentation, inflammation, infection, malignancy, ischemia, and obstruction. Prompt recognition and prompt treatment are critical to prevent the morbidity and potential mortality associated with intestinal perforation.

Evaluation and Management of Intestinal Obstruction

During small bowel obstruction, the normal flow of the contents of the digestive system are completely or partially blocked. Most blockages of the small bowel have had time to rest. A nasogastric tube may be inserted through the nose and into the stomach to remove fluid and decompress the bowel.

Intestinal obstruction is most commonly caused by intra-abdominal adhesions, malrotation, and intestinal herniation. The clinical presentation generally includes nausea and emesis, colicky abdominal pain, and a failure to pass flatus or stool.

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
