An INCREASE in temperature of a contained liquid increases the vapor pressure- the particles have an INCREASED kinetic energy, thus more minimum energy to escape. What is boiling point. the temperature at which the vapor pressure of the liquid is just equal to the external pressure on the liquid. What is normal boiling point.
