An adverb clause is a group of words that function as an adverb in a given sentence. They can be used to explain or modify a verb, adverb or adjective. One can easily identify an adverb clause is that they answer the questions how, where, when and why.

Noun Clause, Adjective Clause and Adverb Clause. Clause = a group of words with a subject and a verb. It can be a full sentence or just part of it. "She likes movies because she wants to be an actress.". It contains two clauses. "She likes movies" is the main clause. "Because she wants to be an actress" is the subordinate clause.
