Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD) in Adolescents

Children may have an obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) when unwanted thoughts, and the behaviors they feel they must do because of the thoughts, happen frequently, take up a lot of time (day), interfere with their activities, or make them very upset. The thoughts are called obsessions. The behaviors are called compulsions.
