1) Lenin adapted Marxism to conditions in Russia. Lenin called for an elite group to lead the revolution and set up a "dictatorship of the proletariat". 2) In Western Europe, many leading socialists had come to think that socialism could be achieved through gradual and moderate reforms such as higher wages, increased suffrage, and social welfare programs.
