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Theta Roles - Simon Fraser University

*Note: Agents are usually the subject of a transitive, ditransitive, or unergative verb. Themes are mostly the direct object of a transitive or ditransitive verb. Goals , source , locations , benefactives , and instruments are normally embedded in a prepositional phrase.

Definition and Examples of Agents in English Grammar

These functions are inexplicitly characterised by classical and modern Arab linguists and Arabists alike.

Subject Theme And Agent In Modern Standard Arabic

The agent is the person or thing that performs the action and is the subject of the active sentence. In most passive sentences, the agent is not mentioned. If it is mentioned, however, it is usually preceded by the preposition *bi*: The pigeons were dispersed by a tourist walking past. (A tourist walking past dispersed the pigeons.) He was hit by a falling branch while walking

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As nouns the difference between subject and agent is that subject is (label) in a clause: the word or word group (usually a noun phrase) that is dealt with in active clauses with verbs denoting an action, the subject and the actor are usually the same while agent is one who exerts power, or has the power to act; an actor. As an adjective subject is likely to be affected by or to experience ...

In French, go behaves like an unaccusative (the past tense is formed with être), suggesting that the subject (in an active clause) is a Theme. On the other hand, it is (at least sometimes) clearly agentive in meaning, suggesting that the subject (in an active clause) is an Agent.
