Testicular cancer has been linked to a history of cryptorchidism and XY gonadal dysgenesis. Exposure to endogenous steroid hormones (particularly high levels of androstenedione) in utero has also been associated with testicular cancer. However, testicular cancer can occur in AYAs without any of these risk factors.

It is recommended that all centres use standardised protocols for follow-up of Stage I testicular cancer which are based on the expected frequency, timing and pattern of disease recurrence; and minimise unnecessary radiation exposure. Other surveillance protocols which are also based on similar principles are appropriate.

Testicular cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of one or both testicles. Testicular cancer is the most common cancer in men aged 15 to 34 years. Testicular cancer can usually be cured. A condition called cryptorchidism (an undescended testicle) is a risk factor for testicular cancer.

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
