Kumulipo is a compound word from kumu " beginning " , and lipo " deep darkness " ; the chant thus means literally " the origin of (or from) deep darkness " , and it begins with a rich evocation of nothingness: The intense darkness, the deep darkness. Darkness of the sun, darkness of the night. Nothing but night.

The Kumulipo, the source of life, is an ancient Hawaiian mele oli, or chant, consisting of over 2000 lines. The ancient Hawaiian kahunas, or priests, would memorize every word and recite the oli at important events such as the festival of the god Lono.

The Kumulipo

In the Hawaiian religion, the Kumulipo is a chant in the Hawaiian language, first recorded by Westerners in the 18th century, and telling a creation story. It also includes a genealogy of the members of Hawaiian royalty and was created in honor of Kalaninuiamamao and passed down orally to his daughter Alapaiwahine .
