Conditional: The conditional of q by p is "If p then q" or "p implies q" and is denoted by p  $\rightarrow$  q.It is false when p is true and q is false; otherwise it is true.: Contrapositive: The contrapositive of a conditional statement of the form "If p then q" is "If  $\neg$ q then  $\neg$ p".Symbolically, the contrapositive of p  $\rightarrow$  q is  $\neg$ q  $\rightarrow$   $\neg$ p.
