Shema Yisrael (Shema Israel or Sh'ma Yisrael; Hebrew: שְׁמָא יִשְׂרָאֵל; "Hear, O Israel") is a Jewish prayer (known as the Shema) that serves as a centerpiece of the morning and evening Jewish prayer services. Its first verse encapsulates the monotheistic essence of Judaism: "Hear, O Israel: YHWH is our God, YHWH is one" (Hebrew: שְׁמָא יִשְׂרָאֵל יְהוָה יְהוָה ...

A mezuzah is a small box that is placed on the right doorpost of Jewish homes. Inside the box is a parchment scroll with verses from the Torah inscribed on it, including the Shema prayer (Deuteronomy 6:4-9, 11:13-21). The concept of a mezuzah comes from the Torah, where we read, "And you shall inscribe them on the doorposts (mezuzot) of your house and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6:9, 11:20).

A mezuzah (Hebrew: ????????? "doorpost"; plural: ?????????? ? mezuzot) is a piece of parchment, known as a klaf, contained in a decorative case and inscribed with specific Hebrew verses from the Torah (Deuteronomy 6:4–9 and 11:13–21). These verses consist of the Jewish prayer Shema Yisrael, beginning with the phrase: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord (is) our God, the Lord is One".
