The theory holds that moral reasoning, the basis for ethical behavior, has six developmental stages, each more adequate at responding to moral dilemmas than its predecessor. Kohlberg followed the development of moral judgment far beyond the

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ages studied earlier by Piaget, who also claimed that logic and morality develop through constructive stages.
