EVAPORATION. Definition: Process by which water is changed from the liquid or solid state into the gaseous state through the transfer of heat energy (ASCE, 1949). It occurs when some water molecules attain sufficient kinetic energy to break through the water surface and escape into the atmosphere (~ 600 cal needed to evaporate 1 gram of water).

Answer: (i) Transpiration: Loss of water as water vapour from aerial parts of the plant. (ii) After 2-3 days the level of water falls in test-tube A while it remains constant in test tube B. (iii) The fall in the level of water in test-tube A due to the absorption of water by the roots.

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
