The conclusion is your “ending,” where you briefly restate what your original argument was. Then you summarize your findings. The main body of the paper is the “middle.” To revise papers like a professional, make sure the body does everything you said it would do in the introduction.

How to Revise, Edit and Proofread Your Writing

Some tips that apply to both editing and proofreading. Get some distance from the text! It's hard to edit or proofread a paper that you've just finished writing—it's still too familiar, and you tend to skip over a lot of errors. Put the paper aside for a few hours, days, or weeks. Go for a run. Take a trip to the beach.

Revising your paper is not skimming a paper while watching TV or listening to a CD. Revising is focusing on many elements in your draft. Does everything in your paper support your thesis, or have you gone off the topic? No matter how much you like a point or a sentence, if it is off the topic, you must cut it.

How to Revise Your Paper for Clarity

What is revision? When you revise a piece of writing, you are looking at the text for possible mistakes. A revision should be followed by a re-drafting of the text. You need to see if your argument follows a logical sequence, if all your ideas are in place, and if you need to include or exclude any points. Think of revision as structural editing.

Revision literally means to “see again,” to look at something from a fresh, critical perspective. It is an ongoing process of rethinking the paper: reconsidering your arguments, reviewing your evidence, refining your purpose, reorganizing your presentation, reviving stale prose. Nope. That's called proofreading.

Why Do We Need to Revise Writing? Show, Don't Tell!

□ Small-Scale Revision: Small-scale revision needs to happen when you know that a certain part of your paper isn't working. Maybe the introduction needs work. Maybe one part of the argument seems weak. Once you've located the problem, you'll focus on revising that one section of your paper.

The aim of revision is to improve your writing's organization, accuracy, and style. Revising is a three-stage process. Each step requires that you read through your entire essay. (No, we aren't kidding! Revision often makes the difference between a C paper and an A paper.)

Revision Checklist for Essays

How much rewriting you do on the computer screen before you print out the paper for the next step in revision is going to depend on how comfortable you are reading text on the computer screen. Most writers find it too easy to skip over problems on the monitor and they need to have copy in hand, literally, to catch all their errors.

Why Do We Revise Papers

There's always a way to improve what we've written. Revising is a call to A.R.M.S. Add description and detail. Remove words, phrases, or sentences that don't fit or make sense. Move words or sentences that would work better in another spot. Substitute vague words with stronger synonyms, dull words with interesting ones.

First drafts of papers almost always require revision because: sentences are unclear or wordy; adjacent sentences do not logically connect to each other (cohesion is poor);

Importantly, revision is usually the stage of the writing process when the writer takes into account the reader. Writers draft what they want to say; in a sense, writers draft for themselves. Joan Didion says, in her essay “Why I Write” (the title of which she borrowed from George Orwell),...
