Teaching Writing With Picture Books and Predictable Charts ...  
Run into the wind. Which is easier? Run faster than the wind. Slower. Skip with the wind. Jump. Hop. Stand still and move your arms like the wind. Twirl and whirl like the wind. Wet a finger and hold it up in the air. What do you feel? (The wind will cool one side as it passes by.) Provide streamers to run with and balloons to chase. Blow bubbles.
