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A literature review is not an annotated bibliography in which you summarize briefly each article that you have reviewed. While a summary of the what you have read is contained within the literature review, it goes well beyond merely summarizing professional literature.

The following are guidelines on how to write a literature review: Organize the literature review around key topics of concepts. Use headings or topic sentences to convey your organizational principle. Tell a story about the research. This will assist you with your organization. Be selective. Incorporate only studies that are pertinent to your subject.
